In chapters of Ephesians1-3 <u>doctrine of the church</u> and in <u>chapters 4-6</u> we have the duty of <u>the church(what we are to as a body of believers</u>)</u> Here, Paul begins to press the believers to live out who they are. But he starts off by reminding that he is a prisoner of the Lord. Suggesting that whatever one's condition in life, pleasant or unpleasant, the joy of serving the Lord need not be lost. That principle is conveyed to us by the word worthy/deseving. The believers must conduct themselves in a way that reflects their new status(The called) the word walk carries the idea of lifestyle. Bottom line, we are to walk in a way matching the position we have in Christ.

#### **4 CHARACTER TRAITS WORTHY OF THE CALL FROM V.1**

<u>1. LOWLINESS/HUMILITY</u> It was Jesus Himself who elevated the term to the highest level, describing Himself as gentle and humble in heart (Matthew 11:29). Christianity introduced a revolutionary concept: The greatest manifestation of power was self-sacrifice! John 13:3-5 is an excellent example taken from the conduct of Jesus with respect to washing the disciples' feet. To Paul, the incarnation of Jesus was the supreme lesson in humility (Philippians 2:5-8) LOWLINESS OF MIND HUMILITY OF MIND

2.GENTLENESS. This virtue is closely tied to humility/lowliness. It incorporates the ideas of good manners and courtesy and alludes to controlled strength; meekness is certainly, not weakness. Jesus described Himself as gentle and humble in heart in Matthew 11:29. This is the most direct description Jesus gives of Himself. It is also ascribed to Him in II Corinthians 10:1. Paul's essential theme in these opening verses of Ephesians 4 is the obligation of the believer to be Christlike. Gentleness is never insubordinate/defiant to God or resentful/bitter toward man.

3.LONGSUFFERING/Patience This virtue is manifested by one who is unwilling to avenge wrongs. It is the attitude that makes allowances for failures. Il Peter 3:9, 15, and I Peter 3:20 demonstrate that it is the perversity of man that brings out this characteristic in God Himself and is revealed in His postponing of deserved judgment (Romans 2:4) 4.BEARING WITH THIS is the natural result of the preceding virtue of patience. The words showing BEARING MEANS TO put up WITH. It is an intensely practical word because it is realistic about the makeup of each one of us. We all have faults that others must endure, and this endurance of one another is a godly characteristic. Each of these four virtues is an aspect of Christian love. The words in love that end verse 2 should be taken in connection with each.

# <sup>3</sup> endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. Eph. 4:3

Diligent/endeavoring/striving suggests two things **<u>First</u>**, it implies difficulty. It is a word frequently used to describe tasks that are difficult to complete. <u>Second</u>, it implies determination. This word is in the present tense showing it is a neverending task. This verse assumes that unity among Christians already exists. This was explained in Ephesians 2:13-18. showing that we are bound to Christ and to one another which is why Paul urges us to exert great effort to and be bound in practice application of (which is highlighted in chapter1-3/doctrine of church). The church at Corinthian church lacked this practical unity I Corinthians 3:1-5 DID YOU NOTICE THAT PAUL COMMANDS US TO KEEP THE UNITY NOT ESTABLISH IT. THIS IS WHAT HAPPENS WHEN WE APPLY THE DOCTRINES AS SET FORTH IN HIS WORD. GOD CALLS US TO PRESERVE WHAT HE'S ALREADY CREATED. THIS IS TIED TO OUR CHARACTER IN V.2 AND IS THE RESULT OF GTHS WORKING.

# <sup>4</sup> There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling Eph 4:4

There is "<u>one body</u>"—The reference is to the church as the body of Christ (Ephesians 1:22-23). In the pagan world, there were a number of religions from which to choose. Religion was not unified; it was varied and competitive. The unity of the body of Christ of which Paul speaks crosses all boundaries—sexual, racial, and social. The condition of membership in the church is faith in Christ, making all who share this faith one body. There is "<u>one Spirit</u>"—GTHS On the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit spanned the greatest of all chasms, the separation of the Jew and the Gentile. The same Spirit that put Paul into union with Christ does the same for all believers. He reminds the Corinthian believers of this fact in I Corinthians 12:12-13. The doctrine of the baptism of the Spirit is strong argument for practical unity among Christians. The baptism of the Holy Spirit is one of seven salvation ministries by God the Holy Spirit.

- 1. Efficacious grace
- 2. Regeneration
- 3. The baptism of the Holy Spirit
  4. The indwelling of the Holy Spirit
  5. The filling of the Holy Spirit
  6. The sealing of the Holy Spirit
  7. Spiritual gifts

The baptism of the Holy Spirit is a real baptism, an actual identification takes place.

It is one of the seven ministries of the God the Holy Spirit at salvation

At the moment of faith GTHS places the believer into union with Christ.

The baptism of the Holy Spirit is the means of forming the royal family of God during the church age.

The indwelling of the Holy Spirit

It is a function of the omnipotence of the Holy Spirit at salvation. By entering into union with Christ, we are adopted as royal family of God.

We are a new spiritual species.

This union with Christ is called positional sanctification or the sanctification of the body

The baptism of the Holy Spirit is the means of empowerment of God

The baptism of the Holy Spirit is not an emotional experience, 1 Cor 12:13.

There is only one baptism that unifies the royal family of God. 1 Cor 12:13; Eph 4:5, Rom 6:3-5,

The next three statements are <u>separate ideas</u> and yet contain a fundamental unity. <u>One\_Lord</u> whom we know is Jesus Christ he is the sovereign ruler of all things <u>one faith</u> <u>one faith\_WOG/doctrine these</u> truths argues for unity and harmony. There is "one faith"—Faith incorporates two ideas. It may refer to one's attitude of believing in Christ, OR it may also refer to the substance of one's belief/God's Word/doctrine. <u>One baptism</u> IT'S POSSIBLE THAT <u>baptism of the Holy Spirit</u>. OR water baptism saying that the only Christian baptism is in the name of Jesus Christ. When we fail to keep unity of the spirit we deny our oneness like cancer a dreaded disease in which cells no longer want to unify with the bodyAS A whole CANCEROUS cells have their own independent program they want to stay in your body but they want to do their own thing and multiply their goal is to shut you down similarly. Satan wants to shut down /God's church and knows nothing will shut us down like DISUNITY since God is a God of order The oneness and unity of BELIEVERS is even reflected in the grammatical gender of the <u>word one found</u> three times in THIS verse 5. The first one is masculine, the second one is feminine, and the third one is neuter. The church is one viewed from any perspective.

#### <sup>6</sup> one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all. Eph 4:6

<u>He is "ABOVE ALL</u>"—Transcendence focuses on the awesomeness of God in terms of the great distance that exists between Him and His creation. This is the meaning of the words ABOVE ALL

He is "<u>THROUGH ALL</u>"—This expresses God's creative and sustaining activity. He is <u>IN ALL</u>"—This expression views the opposite of transcendence which is immanency. The personal presence of God in His creation and His personal relationship to man is focal. God is both near (immanent) and far (transcendent) Considering all three prepositional phrases. we can say the Father is 1. sovereign for He is above all; 2. He is omnipotent for He works through all; 3. and He is omnipresent for He is in all. The Father <u>rules</u>, <u>pervades</u>, and <u>sustains</u>

#### **SEVERAL POINTS OF OBSERVATION**
