<u>1.Crowns of righteousness and life.</u>

The "crown of righteousness" describes the mature believer's capacity to receive and enjoy the greater blessings of the eternal state (2 Tim. 4:8). The "crown of life" honors the mature believer's perseverance under testing and his use of spiritual skills while on earth (James 1:12; Rev. 2:10). Together, these two rewards indicate maximum production of divine good, occupation with Christ, and the positive impact of that believer's life on human history.

2. Crown of glory. This eternal decoration is specially designated for pastors who faithfully communicate the Word of God (Heb. 6:10). The one who obeys the command to "shepherd the flock of God," whatever the size of his local congregation, not for his own gain but according to God's will, will be awarded this distinction once the "Chief Shepherd appears" to bring His Church home (1 Pet. 5:2–4; cf. Col. 1:25–29). As part of his reward, the faithful pastor has the pleasure of presenting the mature members of his congregation before the Lord and watching them receive their eternal rewards (Phil. 4:11; 1 Thess. 2:19–20).

<u>3.The Crown of Rejoicing – (1 Thessalonians 2:19)</u> "For what is our hope, or joy, or crown of rejoicing? Is it not even you in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ at His coming?" The apostle Paul tells us in <u>Philippians 4:4</u> to "rejoice always in the Lord" for all the bountiful blessings our gracious God has showered upon us. As believers we have more in this life to rejoice about than anyone else. Luke tells us there is rejoicing even now in heaven (Luke 15:7). The crown of rejoicing will be our reward where "God will wipe away every tear . . . there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying. There shall be no more pain, for the former things have passed away" (<u>Revelation 21:4</u>).

<u>4. The Imperishable Crown – (1 Corinthians 9:24-25)</u> "Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may obtain it. And everyone who competes for the prize is temperate [disciplined] in all things. Now they do it to obtain a perishable crown, but we for an imperishable crown" (NKJV). All things on this earth are subject to decay and will perish. Jesus urges us to not store our treasures on earth "where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal" (Matthew 6:19). This is analogous to what Paul was saying about that crown that falls apart. But not so the heavenly crown; faithful endurance wins a heavenly <u>reward</u> which is "an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven.

5. The Crown of Righteousness. "Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto them also that love His appearing" (2 Timothy 4:8). Here the character of the reward corresponds to the character of the Giver. Both are said to be righteous. The doctrine of our Lord's return is regarded very highly by God. In spite of the fact that Jesus said He would come again, there are many people who scoff at the thought of Christ's appearing. This and kindred truths have brought suffering and hardship, and in some cases death to those who insisted on preaching and teaching them. But how wonderful to know that God has prepared a special reward for all who look for that blessed hope, who wait for His son from Heaven, and who love His appearing
